Our School Support Worker, John Hutchison reports: *'The schools food growing programme has rolled up its sleeves for a final push and added another 7 primary schools into the scheme. Again funded from Red Apple along with a substantial grant from the West Lancashire Strategic Partnership, the 7 schools are Bishop Martin, St Edmunds, and Elm Tree in Skelmersdale and Crawford Village, All Saints Appley Bridge, Holmeswood and Aughton St Michael's. Staff and children are delighted as they begin work on the recently installed raised beds. Each school will also receive a small pack of tools and equipment to get them underway, along with mentor support from an experienced grower.'*

Our last meeting held at Burscough Cricket Club was very well attended and we welcomed two new reps - Jane Pashley for Skelmersdale Kitchen Gardens and Don Hooley for Burscough CC Gardeners.

On 1st April WLA was represented at the AGM of the Northwest Counties Region (National Society of Allotment and Leisure Growers). Northwest counties has just been extended and now includes Cumbria and South Lakeland. This AGM was held in the Manchester Federation area at the

Crumsall & Cheetham Allotments site. Before the AGM there were a number of presentations including one for the Blackpool Federation for their outstanding work for the allotment community. The Blackpool Federation has just taken over the management of Blackpool allotment sites from the Borough Council. Blackpool council also received an award for their efforts and support in this new venture.

For West Lancs, the **Hesketh Bank Allotments and Leisure Gardeners Association** received the prestigious award for regeneration of an allotment site. This site (pictured right) was officially opened last August by Sir David Bellamy and is well worth a visit.
